To: Plan Members and Contributing Employers

We are pleased to present our Annual Report which outlines the activities of the Fund during the fiscal period ending August 31, 2018.

Participation in training remains robust in the Edmonton Training Centre with 2242 plan members taking 35,464 hours of training and 720 plan members taking 11,400 hours of training in the Calgary Training Centre.

A new Trade Winds contract, for the period of July 4, 2017 - March 31, 2021, has been signed. The Edmonton Training Centre accommodated two Trade Winds sessions, consisting of 17 students.

A new No Show Policy was approved effective January 1, 2018 with non-attendance rates at 2.6% in the Edmonton Training Centre and 3.9% in the Calgary Training Centre.

A lease for additional training space was approved on December 21, 2017.

The Investment Committee monitored investments of the Fund and the investment consultant reported to the Trustees in March and September.

A consultant was retained to facilitate the development of a Maintenance Electrician Program. Surveys were distributed to all contractors covered under the Collective Agreement. A low response rate has resulted in further consultations.

The Board of Trustees also approved:

- A common website between the Electrical Training Centre, EBFA and Local 424.
- ABC Safety and the Canadian Fire Alarm Association as approved institutional training providers.
- A new server for the Edmonton Training Centre.
- The ESTS Consortium Agreement dated November 30, 2017.
- Continuing with the PACT program contingent on labour market needs.
- A change to the Electrical Apprenticeship Tuition Assistance course requirements for reimbursement.
- Ongoing new courses arising from contractor and industry needs.
